



Head and neck surgical anatomy: 'hands-on' cadaver workshop

26th March 2012 Loxley Building, Hull Campus, Hull York Medical School

This cadaver workshop will equip delegates with a good working knowledge of the surgical anatomy of the neck and will in particular include practice of parotid surgery, thyroid and parathyroid surgery, laryngectomy and different types of neck dissection.

Training will be delivered face to face at Hull York Medical School's state-of-the-art anatomy facilities at the University of Hull campus. Under the direction and supervision of expert tutors surgical trainees will become better equipped to perform surgical interventions to a high standard.

At Hull York Medical School a special "lite embalming" technique is used resulting in cadaveric tissues which are much more like real life. The course provides a big safety plus for surgeons and patients and a great advantage for our trainees, allowing a more true-to-life practice before performing procedures on a live patient.

- Cadaveric dissection practice with a delegate to faculty ratio of as little as 2:1
- Opportunity for 'hands-on' practice of surgical technique in a lifelike but safe environment

- Combination of anatomy revision and practising surgical interventions of the head and neck
- Use of a special 'lite embalming' technique which means cadaveric tissues are much more lifelike in colour, tone and flexibility
